# FV Reforms

---

- Crimes (FV) Act 1987
- Began August 2003
- Tabled in parliament March 2006
- 153 recommendations

## Aims of new Act

---

- Ensure safety
- Prevent FV
- Provide effective remedies
- Promote non violence

# Significant changes

---

- Courts to treat safety as paramount
- Encourage magistrates to protect children
- Expand family member to include Carer, kinship relative and other relative according to other practice
- Develop support codes and expand training for police
- Case Management

# Significant changes

---

- Police holding powers increases
- Access to legal advice
- Trained magistrates
- Forms in plain English
- Increase in court safety for victims
- Changes in ways of giving evidence
- Changes in ways to get orders to support victim

# Significant changes

---

- Police can remove perpetrator from home
- Child contact safer
- Breaches heard quickly
- Community Education

## Why Integration and Partnership?

- Because “Good practice violence prevention strategies engage the whole community and do not focus on individual interventions at the expense of analysing the structural context of violence and of individual’s lives.”  
(Hayes, 2006)
