In December the VLGA will be running a free workshop for women in the Central Highlands region who are considering running for local government in 2020, answering all these questions and more.

Women make up 51 per cent of Victoria's population – they should make up more than 38 per cent of local government councillors in Victoria.

The VLGA is here to connect women with the knowledge, skills and contacts to do that on a larger scale – as local government councillors.
