**Margaret Kett: Kids' Own Publishing** is a Melbourne-based publisher and arts organization which equips children to become autonomous and active creators of the future. Over 16 years, we have nurtured a committed and diverse artist team to support children to tell their lives and truths as citizens, in art and words, in community and education settings, public spaces, events and celebrations. We have partnered with local governments to deliver long-term community publishing projects involving artist-led workshops culminating in the design, printing and launch of beautiful children's books. We also offer short installation-style residencies such as the <u>6<sup>th</sup> NGV Melbourne Art Book Fair</u> and artist and children's community publishing training for educators and community workers.

Anna and Margaret from Kids' Own will describe their work through examples of key projects and partnerships, including the recent development of Kids' Home Publishing to continue to reach and inspire children and families during the pandemic, and most importantly, give them a voice in uncertain times.
