• Charry provided an excellent overview of the Babaneek Booboop Early Years Project which is a community-focused program promoting positive health and early childhood outcomes for Aboriginal children in the City of Melton and Moorabool Shire





- The project links children and their families to local early years and child health services, promotes cultural safety, encourages relationship-building and self-determination
- The project has been operating for 4 years and has successfully engaged over 60 families and 120 children.

- Douglas shared the work he is leading on the Children and Young People Safety Project
- Douglas focused on the Safeguarding Portal and the Children's Safety Survey tools that are available for organisations and professionals to access to support their work with Children and Young People
